
## GRASPING GOD'S WORD

But is to be carefully read, interpretated wisely and committing to apply what we know.


John 14:21 "The person who has my commandments and obeys them is one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and will reveal myself to him."

"A person who truly grasps God's Word will find that Word grasping them."




# Grasping God's Word Interpretive Journey

- Interpretation does matter, but proper interpretation is a MUST
- Christians read the Bible because they believe in it!
- The Bible encourages us, lifts our spirit, comforts us, guides us, chides us, builds us up, gives us hope, and brings us close to the living God
- READING the text thoroughly and carefully lies at the beginning of the journey.
  - Able to see meaning in biblical context to the biblical audience
- What separates us from the Biblical Audience?
  - Culture, customs, language, situation, vast expanse of time, change in covenant,
- The list above is a large river to cross but there is a safe way to cross




Our goal is to **grasp** the meaning of the text **God** has *intended*.

- Steps in the Interpretive Journey will allow us to find that meaning but not to forget it is HARD WORK
- Step 1 Grasping the Text in their Town
  - What did the text mean to the biblical audience?
    - Read carefully
    - Look, look, look...see all you can
    - Scrutinize the grammar
    - Analyze all significant words
    - Study historical and literary context
    - What are the words before and after your passage of scripture.
- Caution- careful to not to generalize or form theology yet




Step 2: Measuring the Width of the River to Cross

- Identify common differences, in culture, language, situation, time, and often covenant
- Focus on the unique differences found in a specific text
- If you are studying an Old Testament passage, you must account for the life and work of Jesus Christ.




#### **Step 3 – Crossing the Priciplizing Bridge**

- Reflect on the theological principles/point or principles/points found in Step 1
  - We are not to create the meaning but to discover the meaning
- Recall the differences you indentfied in Step 2
- Identify any similarities between the situation of the biblical audience and our situation
- Differences + similarities + meaning for the biblical audience = The Message or The Point




#### **Step 3 – Crossing the Priciplizing Bridge**

- Are we on the right track with the Theological Principle/Point
  - It should be reflected in the text
  - It should be timeless and not tied to a specific situation
  - It should not be culturally bound
  - It should correspond to the teaching of the rest of Scripture
  - It should be relevant to both the biblical and contemporary audience
- The Principle/Point or Principles/Popints should only be
   1 or 2 sentences.



#### Step 4 – Consult the Biblical Map

- Is your principle/point consistent with the rest of scripture.
  - Harmony of scripture
- If the principle is valid it should fit with the rest of scripture
- If your principle comes from a Old Testament reading, you will want to run it through the New Testament –
  - How does the New Testament add or modify



#### Step 5 – Grasping the Text in our Town

- How does the Principle/Point apply in reallife situations today?
- Each passage will only have a few or often only one Principle/Point
  - The point will have numerous applicable possibilities
    - Due to current life situations
    - Where we are in our relationship to God
