 - The Spirit as the Divine Author
 - Inspiration Holy Spirits work in the lives of the human authors of Scripture with the result that they wrote what God wanted to communicate
 - God-Breathed
 - Illumination refer to this ongoing work of the Spirit
 - Inspiration and illumination must never be set against one another


- Can we Grasp God's Word apart from the Spirit?
 - Yes if unbelievers use valid interpretive methods, they are able to comprehend much of the Bible
 - At a level of cognitive understanding, the Spirit appears to play a minimal role
 - Yes, but Only to a Degree
 - Sin has had an effect on the whole person, including the human mind
 - Unbelievers' ability to understand the meaning is limited by the effects of the unbelieving preunderstanding that they bring to the text
 - 2 Corinthians 4:4
 - Without the Spirit only to degree, understanding involves mind, emotions, body, and etc....

- Can we Grasp God's Word apart from the Spirit?
 - NO
 - Without the Spirit people can't accept and apply the truths
 - 1 Corinthians 2:14

- Can we Grasp God's Word apart from the Spirit?
 - The Spirit and the Christian Interpreter
 - 1. a. When it comes to biblical interpretation, having the Holy Spirit does not mean that Spirit is all we need. The Spirit does not make valid interpretation automatic.
 - b. The Spirit does expect us to use our minds, proper interpretive methods, and good study helps to interpet the Bible accurately.
 - 2. a. The Spirit does not create new meaning or provide new information
 - b. We can rely on the Spirit to help us grasp the meaning of God's Word
 - 3. a. The Spirit does not change the Bible to suit our purposes or to match our circumstances
 - b. The Spirit brings the meaning of the Bible to bear on the reader
 - i. The Spirit convicts us that the Bible is divinely inspired

- Can we Grasp God's Word apart from the Spirit?
 - The Spirit and the Christian Interpreter
 - 3. a. The Spirit does not change the Bible to suit our purposes or to match our circumstances
 - b. The Spirit brings the meaning of the Bible to bear on the reader
 - i. The Spirit convicts us that the Bible is divinely inspired
 - ii. The Spirit works in our minds to impress on us the full meaning of the Scriptures
 - iii. The Spirit works in our hearts so that we are able to receive the Word of God (application)

- Can we Grasp God's Word apart from the Spirit?
 - The Spirit often uses devotional reading and prayer to encourage spiritual growth
 - Silencio Silence
 - Lectio Reading
 - Meditatio Meditation
 - Oratio Speech, Oration
 - Contemplatio State of being with God, prayer
